Application for Research Poster Session

Poster Proposal Submission Directions

Only completed or nearly completed (i.e., all data collected, most analyses completed and summarized) research will be accepted. Proposal, NOT including tables, figures, and references (maximum: 1000 words).



Proposal should include:

- Study purpose
- Theoretical framework
- Methodology
- Results
- Conclusions
- Educational implications
- Complete information for author(s) including affiliation(s)
- Descriptive title (maximum: 15 words)
- Three keywords

Each proposal will be judged according to the following criteria: educational or scholarly significance, perspective or theoretical framework, appropriateness of methodology, clarity of expression, and appeal to CARR membership. Details about research event dates and times will follow upon finalization of program.

Poster Format

Poster size should be no larger than 36" x 48" (trifold board). The display should be easily read and clear from a distance of at least 3 feet from the board. The title, author, and affiliation should be at least 36 point font. The rest of your lettering should be at least 28 point font. Be sure to include diagrams, figures, photos, bulleted text, or other visuals that describe your research.
